| 1 | When the Trail official signals a successful 3-point goal, the Lead official will mirror that signal. | Yes | No |
| 2 | All situations that involve counting require the official to display a visible count. | Yes | No |
| 3 | Prior to the start of the second, third and fourth quarters, the official shall sound the whistle, state the jersey color and signal the direction of play. | Yes | No |

| 30 | At the site of a foul ruling, the official shall state the color of the jersey, the number of the player who committed the foul, signal the type of foul. | Yes | No |
| 31 | Player control, intentional and technical fouls do not require the official to first signal timeout/stop the clock. | Yes | No |
| 32 | Indicating the throw-in spot and designating the throw-in spot have the same meaning. | Yes | No |
| 33 | Reporting the foul requires the official to “clear” the players and come to a stop before communicating to the table. | Yes | No |
